She and her husband have three married sons and eight grandchildren, so far.

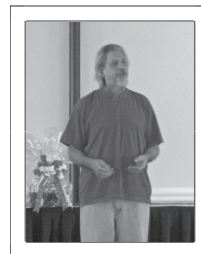

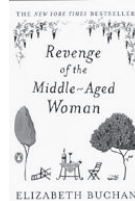

HEATHROW WOMEN'S CLUB FINANCES 101

Although most of us are generally not that interested in the details of HWC's finances, there have been some questions lately regarding what HWC's \$25 annual dues pays for. (Keep in mind that the \$50 annual dues to HWCC goes towards supporting charitable fundraising during the year and distribution of money to our charities in May.) This is a very reasonable question and one that the Board of Directors felt deserved an explanation. So here I am writing this article about HWC's finances. The dollar amounts set forth below are expenses from the 2008-2009 fiscal year since the 2009-2010 fiscal year is not over yet, therefore, the numbers are incomplete. Keep in mind when you are reviewing these expenses that the only sources of income to HWC are the \$25 annual dues per member and any income received from advertising in The Newz. Both of these sources of income are variable year-to-year requiring the Board to make an educated guess on what the total income will be for the year based on the previous year's income.

For the 2009-2010 fiscal year, the Board of Directors eliminated the Monthly Board Meeting Expenses by moving those meetings from Heathrow Country Club to the Sawyer Lake Park Pavilion in Heathrow and providing its own coffee and refreshments. The Newsletter Printing and Postage expense has been significantly reduced with the distribution of The Newz in e-mail although Newsletter Printing and Postage expenses are still incurred to mail The Newz to those members without e-mail and to put copies of The Newz at the Heathrow Management office and in the office of various local realtors. This expense is approximately \$35.00 per month.

If you deduct Monthly Board Meeting Expenses and Newsletter Printing and Postage expenses from the Total 2008-2009 Expenses, you are still left with \$1,812.48 in expenses. These are typical annual HWC expenses. If you add in the \$35.00 per month, or \$350.00 annually, for The Newz that total comes to \$2,162.48. HWC also pays the lunch cost for our Program presenters. Keep in mind that Total Income for the 2009-2010 fiscal year to date is only \$2,937.00.

You're probably wondering why at every luncheon it sounds like HWC has such a high checking account balance. I know I would be wondering if I were you. First of all, HWC must maintain a minimum bank balance of \$3,000.00. Second, many times the payment for the previous month's luncheon has not yet been paid but the money collected for that luncheon has already been deposited. Luncheon collections average \$1,400.00 per month. And, finally, the Board of Directors wants to maintain a cushion of money for any unexpected expenses and for those expenses that are incurred once in a while, for example, the purchase of green binders for the Membership Yearbook which currently cost \$14.47 each for 50, or a total of \$723.50.

I'm sure I've provided more information than anyone wanted. I hope I've answered any questions that members have had regarding HWC finances. Please feel free to call me at 407-833-0498 or e-mail me at patdarrah@cfl.rr.com if you need any further explanations.
